Tag Rugby and Cricket skills teaching	<i>Children took part in a range of competitions and festivals throughout the academic year as evidenced on SPWA and Your School Games. Children competed in 12 different intra-school competitions, including competitions specifically targeted at those identified as least active. Furthermore, we also competed in 7 events at an inter-school level. Only 16% of young people in our school were engaged in leading, managing and officiating our School Games activity. Next year we will look to increase this percentage by making full use of the ESSP mini-leaders scheme. Over 90% of children passed their Bikeability course. Those who did not pass are given further opportunities to complete their level 1 or 2 this coming year.</i>

School Swimming Training for SM – April 2018.	<i>SM completed the relevant swimming training and ran swimming interventions throughout the academic year. As a result, children benefitted from smaller group sessions and one-on-one tuition. 87% of last year's Year 6 cohort were able to swim at least 25m. Those within the current Year 6 class will join the Year 5 class and benefit from extra sessions this academic year. Those identified as gifted and talented from last year's Year 6 were given opportunities to enhance swimming lessons by modelling strokes and supporting less able swimmers. The school achieved a top 3 finish in the Swimming Gala, inspiring younger children within the school to replicate their achievements.</i>

Midday staff benefitted from training regarding organised games and activities. Pupils now benefit from structured provision each day</i>
